Dear Mr. Schweitzer:

As the buildup of forces in Afghanistan grows, Mine Resistant Armored Protected (MRAP) vehicles are being rushed in to support and protect them. In this rush, some of the vehicles arrived without all necessary equipment having been installed in them. SINCGARS is the primary FM radio used by our military forces for voice command and control, and is a part of almost every vehicle. In many of the MRAP variants crewman need to be able to remotely control their SINCGARS radios because they can not physically reach them. Thus ITT developed the Vehicular Remote Control Unit (VRCU) and installation cabling needed to allow the crewman to both communicate and protect their fellow soldiers. We received an emergency request to provide both the VRCU's and cabling so that the vehicles could be made mission capable and issued to our forces. In less than one week from our request, your company had fabricated, tested, and delivered to us the urgently needed cables which are now on their way to Afghanistan. You and put in long hours and worked over a weekend to ensure that our troops would be able to perform their mission of protecting all our forces.

I would like to express my sincerest appreciation and commendation to you for your outstanding efforts and dedication that you have shown in your desire to in any way assist and protect our military forces to the office of the Project Manager (PM) Command Posts.
